

# THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

## ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION.

No. 11 of 1908.

An Act to grant and apply an additional sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and eight.

[Assented to 3rd June, 1908.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives as follows :— Preamble.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Additional Appropriation Act* 1907-8. Short title.

2. The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and eight the sum of One hundred and fifty-nine thousand seven hundred and forty-six pounds. Issue and application of £159,746.

3. The said sum granted by this Act is appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Act No. 2 of 1907 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule. Appropriation of supply.
