# SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION 1907-8.

#### No. 13 of 1909.

An Act to appropriate a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and eight.

(Assented to 13th December, 1909.)

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows: -

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation Short title. Act 1907-8.
- 2. The sum of Twenty-one thousand nine hundred and five pounds Appropriation of £21.905. which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and eight shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Act No. 2 of 1907 for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act.
