#### REGULATIONS UNDER THE DEFENCE ACT 1903-1912.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MILITARY FORCES OF THE COMMONWEALTH-REGULATIONS 2, 3, 4, 11, 57, 780, 1144, 134, 237, 544, and 556.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Countil, broby make the following Regulatians under the Hefner Act 1903-1912 to come into operation forthwith. Such Regulatians shell supersede the Provisional Regulatians, Statutery Busice Nos. 312, 313, 322, 323 at 1913, and Nas. 5, 13, 27, 29, 31 at 1914.

#### AMENDMENTS.

# The Military Board.

Regulation 2-The paragraph which reads as fallows:-

"The Military Board will refer all matters in connexian with the appointments of Commandants and Officers of the District Hoad-Quarters Staffs, and the appointments of Officers to command for regiments and corps to the Inspector-General for his advice and recommendation."

is cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:-

The Millary Board will consider and make recommendations with regard to all prometions in the Millary Forces to ranks above the rank of Major as well as the appointment of Officers to be Commandants and to command regiments and corps."

## Promotion Board.

Regulation 3, which reads as fellows:-

"The Promation Board consists of—The Inspector-General, President; the Adjutant-General and the Sazior District Commandant doing duly with transp, members. The Chief of Ordanace will attend the meetings of the Board to advise on all promotions of Artillery and Engineer officers.

Regulation 11-d/ter the second paragraph, which reads-

"In the case of a District Commandant being temperarily absent from his district, or unable for temperary reasons to perform his duties, the functions of his command may be administed by the senior or other Staff Officer present, subject to the approval of the Military Board."

"In the event of the office of District Commandant becoming vacant the conior or other Staff Officer in the district may he appointed by the Governor-Ganeral to temporarily administer the functions of command pending the appointment of a successor to the District Commandant."

Officers-First Appaintment.

Regulation 57, which reads-

"First appointments will, as a rule, be made to the rank of Second Lisutenant (but to rank of Captain in the case of the Australian Army Medical Corps, and to the rank of Licotenant in the case of the Australian Intelligence Corps and Australian Army Veterinary Corps)."

is cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:-

"57. First appointments will, as a rule, he made to the rank of Scend Lieutenoit (but to rank of Saptain in the ease of the Australian Army Medical Corps, and of the Army Veterinary Corps (Citicon Forces), and to the rank of Lieutenant in the case of the Australian Intelligence Sarps,"

The following heading he inserted before Regulation 780:-

"APPRINTMENTS TO THE AVIATION INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF."

Regulation 114A is cancelled, and the following substituted there-

"114A. A Seniar Chaplain for each of the denominations referred to in Regulation 114 shall be uppointed in each Military District to administer the Chaplains of his own denomination in the district." Such Soniar Chaplain shall either be-

- (a) The head of the denamination in the Military District, or if he is unable to so act-
  - (b) Such other elergyman as he, or the recognised denomina-tional governing or causultative body may recommend."

State Rifle Associations.

Regulation 558 is cancelled, and the following substituted there-

" 558. In each Military District there shall be a State Rifle Asseciation which shall be governed by a Council consisting of a President, one representative of the Naval Farces nominated by the District Naval Officer, the authorised number of representatives of District Riffs Club Unions, such number of alected members as shall be provided by the rules of the Association, and a number of mambers equal to the number of alected members, to be appointed annually by the District Commandant.

The Council shall be charged with the conduct of all rifls matches (other than those taid down by the Military Regulations) and the promotion of rifls shooting generally.

The District Commandant shall be the President ex officio, and shall preside at all meetings of the Council at which he may be present, but may if he so desires at any such meeting delegate such duty to the Chairman elected by the Council.

The Council will, as a consultative body, also swist the Commandant in all matters affecting the interests of rike shooting in the Military District, or portion of the Military District, allotted to such Association."
