PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1915.

REGULATION 46 .- AMENDMENT.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of A. Australia, acting with the advise of the Federal Executive Council, hereby certify that, on account of urgency, the following regulation under the Wear Precautions Act 1914-1916 should come into immediate operation, and make the Regulation to come into operation forthwith as a Provisional Regulations.

WAR PRECAUTIONS REGULATIONS.

A mendment.

Regulation 46 is cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:—
46. If any person—

Forder and

- (e) forges, alters, or tampers with any naval, military, or police-pass, permit, or other document, or any passport, estrificate of naturalization, letter of safe conduct, consular certificate or other efficial document evidencing the netionality of the person named in it or
- (b) uses nr has in his possession any such forged, altered, or irregular pass, or other document; or
 (c) personates any person to whom such a pass or other
- document has bean duly issued; or (d) allows any other person to have possession of any
- (d) allows any other person to have possession of any such pass or other document issued to him; or
- (e) applies to any building, structure, premises or vehicles any lights, letters or msrks, for the time being used to indicate that buildings, structures, premises, or vehicles, to which they are applied are used for naval or military purposes, or any lights, letters or marks, so nearly resembling the same as to be calculated to decesive.

he shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.
