Form of Claim for Bounty.

Regulation 10 of the Iron Bounty Regulations 1915 (Statutory Rules 1915, No. 83) is hereby amonded by the insertion of the following additional clause after clause 2 of the declaration to be indersed on claim for bounty:-

"2A. The goods the subject of this claim consist of pig iron manufactured and sold for foundry purposes only."
