PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1915.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby certify that, on account of urgoney, the following Regulations under the 19ra Precautions Act 1914-1915 should come into immediate operation, and make the Regulations to come into operation ferthwith as Provisional Regulations.

AMENDMENT OF WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRIORS ADJUSTMENT) REGULATIONS 1916 (STATUTORY RULES 1916, No. 40, AS AMENDED BY STATUTORY RULES 1916, NOS. 46, 53, AND 62).

- Regulation 8 of the War Precautions (Prices Adjustment) Regu- Amendment of lations is amended by omitting, from sub-regulation (1) thereof, the Bequision 8, words "the Schedule" and inserting in their stead the words "the First Schedule."
- 2, Regulation 9a of the War Precautions (Prices Adjustment) Regulation 9a. Amendment of latious is amended—
 - (a) by omitting from paragraph (a) thereof the word "and";
 - (b) hy inserting therein, after paragraph (b), the following paragraph:-
 - "and (c) declare that, as regards any proclaimed area, any price fixed by or under these Regulations shall after a date specified by him, cease to be the maximum price at which flour, bread, hran or pollard may be sold or offered for sale in that area."
- 3. The Schedule of proclaimed areas to the War Pressutions (Prices Angeleest of Adjustment) Regulations is amended by omitting therefrom the heading Schedule "The Schedule" and inserting in its stead the heading "The First structure Schedule".

4. The Schedule of Forms to the War Processions (Price Adjust encoderated ment) Regulations is smeaded by omitting therefrom the heading "The Schedule", and inserting in its stead the heading "The Second Bchedule."

5. After Regulation 12 of the War Precautions (Prices Adjustment) Regulations the following regulations are inserted:

" PREIGHT ON SUGAR.
