REGULATION UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

I, SIR ARTHUR STANLEY, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dopondencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting as the Deputy of the Governor-General in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulatian under the War Precautions Act 1914-1916 to come into operation forthwith.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (COMPANIES) REGULATIONS 1916.

(Statutery Rules 1916, No. 49.)

The War Precautions (Companies) Regulations are amended by adding at the end of Regulation 5 thereof the following provise:—

"Provided that nothing in this Regulation shall be censtrued to prevent or affect or to have prevented or affected any transactions in respect of advances, in the ordinary course of business, by any bank on such securities as the hank usually requires, or to npply or have applied in any way to the transaction of any ordinary hanking business unless the company, firm, society, club, or association receiving or having received the advance gives debentures or debenture bonds for periods of twelve months or longer."
