WAR PRECAUTIONS REQUESTIONS 1916-REQUESTED AMENDMENT.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL is ond over the Commenwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following regulation under the War Percentions det 1914-1916 to come into operation forthwith.

## WAR PRECAUTIONS REDULATIONS 1916.

Amendment.

Regulation 280 is amonded to read as follows:-

22b. (1) The Chief of the General Staff or the Deputy Chief a diseases of Center or any portion whom the Chief of the Honeral Staff or the "fine-releventh Deputy Chief Censor may authorize to exercise the power conferred enables." by sui-regulation 1 of this Regulation may by order in writing require the owner, lessee, or person appearently in charge of any entenuts graph film to submit before publication to any porson named in the order, by stowing the same on a proper scroen, any film which relates or refers to the present wer or to any subject connected therewith or arising therefore or which depicts anything in the nature of a carbon or otherwise that might be considered offensive to the subjects of any siliced or neutral country or which

relates or refers to any of the subjects mentioned in Regulation 19.

(2) An order may be given under this Regulation in respect of a particular subject or of all the subjects referred to in sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with an order given under this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.

(4) The Dopaty Chief Censor or any competent naval or military authority or any person authorized by any of them, or any police constable or officer of Costons, may saster any premises suspected to contein any film within sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation, and may seize and detain any film the exhibition of which would constitute an offence under any of these Regulations or would be offensive to the subjects of any allied or neutral power.
