REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS AOT 1914-1916-

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REGULATIONS 1916.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the War Precautions . let 1914-1916, to come into operation forthwith.

Spet: Regulations shall supersede the Provisional Regulations contained in Statutory Rules 1016, No. 120.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSFORTS) REGULATIONS 1916.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the War Precautions (Passports) short life. Regulations 1916.

2. In these Regulations-

" Passnort " means a passport issued or renewed not more than Interpretation. two years proviously by, or on behalf of, the Government of the country of which the person to whom it relates is a subject or ertizon, and which is still in force, or some other document satis-factorily establishing the untionality and identity of the person to whom it relates, to which passport or document there is attached a photograph of the person to whom it relates.

"Competent unval or military antiority " has the same meaning as in the War Procautions Regulations 1815.

3. After the first day of September, 1916, no person whose are presented as a september of the second set of the seco unless he is in possession of a passport which, in the case of a person coming from a foreign country, has been issued or visced by the British Ambassador or a British Consul in that country, and in the case of a person coming from another part of the British Dominions has been issued or visced by the proper authorities in that part of the Dominions. Persons leaving Commonwealth to have passports. 4. After the first day of August, 1916, ne person whose age exceeds or appears to au allear to exceed fifteen years shall embark at any place in the Commonwealth for any place boyend the Commonwealth unless he is in possession of a measurer.

5. (1) Regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations shall not apply to-

- (i) Any member of the Naval or Military Forces of any part of the British Dominious entering or leaving the Commonwealth on duty:
- (ii) any member of the enew of any vessel who has signed on in any country outside the Commonwealth and who leaves the Commonwealth in continuation of the same voyage in the same vessel, or any member of the crew of any vessel who signs on in Australia for an oversee voyage who satisfies a competent naval or military autherity that he is by occupation a gentaring man;
- (iii) ony person visiting New Zealand, if he is in passession of a pormit to visit New Zealand issued by or under the authority of the Department of External Affairs, and if he travels in a vessel trading solely between the Commonwealth and New Zealand:
- (iiia) any person returning from New Zealand, if he is persession of a permit to visit New Zealand issued by or under the nuthoring of the Department of Extornal Affairs in whatover reased he travels;
 - (iv) any person visiting the Commonwealth from New Zealand or returning to New Zealand, if he is in possession of a permit to visit the Cerntanonwealth issued by the proper authorities in New Zealand
 - (v) any person going to or retarning from Papus or Norfolk Island who is employed by the Administration of either of those places;
 - (vi) all houd-fide residents or tourists travelling to a from Papina or Norfolk Islands who hold return tickets;
 - (vii) any person to whom a certificate excempting him from the dictation test under the *Immigration .let* 1901-1913 has been issued by or under the authority of the Department of External Affairs so long as the certificate remains inflorce; and

(2) (a) The Minister for Defence, or any officer or other person authorized by him to grant exemptions, may exampt any person from any or all of the provisions of Regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations.

(b) If such exemption he granted subject to any condition and the person to whom it is granted fails to comply with such condition he shall be guilty of an offence.

Power to detain passports. 6. (1) Any officer of the Naval or Military Forces and any officer of Customs or police, and any person authorized in shat behalf by a competent naval or military authority may take possession of any passpert in the possession of any person entering the Commenwealth.

(2) Any passport taken under the power conferred by these Regulations may be delained by any person authorized by the Minister in that Author initi therpieon Groun boold in the Commonwealth. 7. Any person who-

- (a) attemps to commit, or procures, aids or abets, or does any act stelling preparatory to, the commission of any act prohibited by these Regulations, Regulations, or
- (b) knowingly harbors any person whom he knows or has reasonable grounds for supposing to have acted in centravention of these Regulations.

shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.

8. If any person obstructs or otherwise interferes with or impedes obstructor any efficer who is carrying out the orders of the competent naval or enformance military authority, or who is authorized in that behalf by the Minister, of duties, or who is otherwise acting in accordance with his duty under these Rega lations, he shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of these Regu-Intions

9. It shall be the duty of every person who knows that some other naived person is acting in contravention of these Regulations to inform a competent naval or military authority of the fact, and if he fails to do so of Regulations. he shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of these Regulations.

10. Any person who acts in contravention of these Regulations or Annu. who is reasonably suspected of having so acted or being about so to act. may be taken into custody without warrant by any officer of Customs or police or by any person authorized in that behalf by a competent navel or military authority.

11. (1) Any person who for the purpose of obtaining a passport ready for makes any fulse or misleading statement whether in writing or verbally making the statement. shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Any person who in recommending any other person for or submitting any document in support of an application for a passport for such person makes any false or mialcading statements therein either in regard to such person or to infinisal shall be guilty of an offence.

12. (1) Regulation 17s of the War Precautions Regulations 1915 Boyes. (Statutory Rules 1915, No. 130, as amended by Statutory Rules 1916, No. 67) is repealed as from the date of the making of these Regulations.

(2) Regulation 56n of the War Precautions Regulations 1915 (Statutory Rules 1915, No. 130, as amended by Statutory Rules 1916, No. 47) is repealed, as from the dato specified in Regulation 4 of these Regulations.
