# REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

WAR PRECAUTIONS REGULATIONS 1915-REGULATION 59D-ADDITION.

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL, in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following regulation under the War Precautions set 1914-1916 to come into operation forthwith.

### WAR PRECAUTIONS REGULATIONS 1915.

#### Addition.

The War Precautions Regulations 1915 are amended by adding after Precise formal Regulation 59c, the following Regulation:—

"59D. In any proceedings against the master of a vessel for an proceedings offence against these Regulations the averment of the prosecutor—

(a) that the defendant is the master of the vessel; or

(b) that the vessel is a British vessel; or

(c) that the vessel is a merchant vessel, or is engaged in any particular class of trade

shall be deemed to be proved in the absence of proof to the contrary."
