## REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT

I SIR ARTHUR STANLEY, Governer of the State of Victoria and its Dopondoneies in the Commonwealth of Australia, cating as the Depays of the Guerran-Georgal in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, noting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulances under the True Precentions Act 1914-1916 to came into operation forthwith.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PRICES) REGULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules 1916 No. 166 as amonded by Statutory Rules 1916 Nn. 188.)

 Regulation 15 of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the following autoregulation

"(2.) For the purposes of this regulation any person on whose behalf or at whose place of business any foodstuffs or necessary commodities are said or offered for saie at a genetic price than the maximum prise fixed by or under these Regulations for the sale of those foodstuffs or necessary commedities at the case may be, or on whose behalf or at whose place of business those ore charged for services any higher rates then the maximum rates fixed under these Regulations, whether the foodstuffs ar accessary commodities are said or offsered for sale, or the rates over charged, centrary to the matruetions of the person or not, shall be guilty at an offonce."

2. Regulation 16 of the War Precautions (Prices) Regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the following provise .--

"Provided that in the one of freight on the carriage, from any port in Australia, to any other part in Australia, a sugar or of any syrup or trends the product of sugar, the maximum freight which may be charged without the written consent of the Minister shall be the maximum freight which was charged during the year 1915 on the carriage of the sugar, syrain, or treede, as the case may be, from the first-neutrinosed port to the least-mentioned port."
