REGULATION UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

SIR JOHN MADDEN, acting as the Depüty of the Governor-deneral in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulation under the War Precautions Act 1914-1916 to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (COMPANIES) REGULATIONS 1916.

(Statutory Rules 1916, Nos. 49 and 137.)

The War Precautions (Companies) Regulations 1916 are amended by inserting after Regulation 5 the following Regulation: -

"5A.—(1). Any person who, without the consent of the Trea- Persons not to surer, takes or continues to take any steps towards the voluntary remove liquidation of a company or towards the removal of the place of registration of company from Australia to another country, shall without constitutions. be guilty of an offence.

- "(2). The Treasurer may attach to his consent such conditions as he thinks fit.
 - "(3). Any person who fails to comply with any of the conditions attached to the consent of the Treasurer shall be guilty of an offence."
