WAR PRECAUTIONS REGULATIONS 1915-REGULATION 12B-ADDITION.

WAR PRECAUTIONS REGULATIONS 1915.

## Addition.

The War Precautions Regulations 1915 are amended by inserting the following new Regulation after Regulation 12A:-

12B. The Minister may by order forbid the supplying by other Power to than Licensed Victuallers of any intoxicating liquor within the of liquor in limits of any area or areas from time to time specified in such order specified areas, to any Members of His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces; and any person who supplies or knowingly permits the supply of such intoxicating liquor to any Member or Members of His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces at any place within such specified area shall be guilty of an offence.
