REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REGULATIONS 1916—REGULATION 5— AMENDMENTS.

I, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulation under the *War Precautions Act* 1914-1916 to come into operation forthwith.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REGULATIONS 1916. AMENDMENTS.

Clauses (iii) and (iii a) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 5 are amended to read as follows:—

(iii) any person visiting New Zealand, if he is in possession of a permit to visit New Zealand issued by the proper authorities in the Commonwealth, and if he travels in a vessel trading solely between the Commonwealth and New Zealand;

(iii a) any person returning from New Zealand, if he is in possession of a permit to visit New Zealand issued by the proper authorities in the Commonwealth, in whatever vessel he travels;

Clause (vii) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 5 is amended to read as follows:—

(vii) any person to whom a certificate exempting him from the dictation test under the *Immigration Act* 1901-1912 has been issued by the proper authorities in the Commonwealth so long as the certificate remains in force.
