REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1916.

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commenwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Councit, hereby make the following Regulations under the Blar Precautions Act 1914-1918 to come into operation forthwith, with the exception of the amendment of clause (ii) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation 5 which shall come into operation on and from the 1st day of July, One theusand nine hundred and seventeem.

WAS PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REUCLATIONS 1916.

(Statutory Rule No. 206 of 1916, as amended by later Statutory Rules.)

- Regulation 2 is amended by inserting the following definition:—
 "Officer" means a competent naval or military authority or any
 parson authorized by a competent naval or military authority to
 exercise the powers conferred on officers by those Regulations, or a
 member of the Police Force, or an officer of Customs.
- 2 Regulations 3 and 4 are amended by substituting the word "sixteen" for the word "fifteen" wherever occurring.
- 3. Clause (ii) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation 5 is amended (as from 1st July, 1017), to read as follows:—
 - "(ii) any alien member of the crow of an oversen vessal arriving in the Communwealth who lands at any port having on his person the curtificate of his registration under the War Precautions (Aliens Registration) Regulations 1916, provided that he rejoins his vessel during her stay in that port."
- Sub-regulation (1) of regulation 5 is amended by inserting the following new clause (iib) after clause (iia):—
- "(iii) any member of the crew of an oversea vessel who lands in the Commonwealth as a result of shipwreck, or who being seriously ill lands for medical treatment, and who is exempted from being in possession of a passport by a competent naval or military authority or a person authorized to act for a competent authority; C.4735.—Prace 3n.

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5. Clause (iii) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation 5 is amended to read as follows:-

"(iii) key person vinting New Zealand, or leaving the Commonwealth to settle in New Zealand, if , so is in possestion...) a persist to visit New Zealand or to heave the Commonwealth to settle in New Zealand issued by the proper authorities in the Commonwealth, and if he travels in a vessel trading solely between the Commonwealth and New Zealand."

6. Regulation 6 is amended to read as follows:-

"6. (1) Any person entering the Commonwealth who is required by these Regulations to be in possession of a passport shall at the first port of call give up his passport to an officer on board the vessel in which he enters the Commonwealth, unless axempted by an officer from this requirement.

(2) If allowed to retain his pessport, or if the passport is returned to him at the first port of call, he shall if required by an efficer

give it up at any subsequent port of call.

(3) Before an alien seaman signed on outside the Commonwealth is discharged in the Commonwealth, he shall (unless exempted under clause (iih) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation (5)), lodge his measuret with an officer authorized to receive it.

(4) Any passport of which possession is taken under the power conferred by those Regulations may be detained by any person authorized by the Minister in that behalf until the person from whem it was taken emburks from, any place in the Commonwealth."

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
