## REGULATION UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-1910,

T THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL is and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Feloral Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulation, under the War Preconfions Act 1914-1916, to come into supercitica forligible.

AMENOMENT OF THE WAR PRECAUTIONS (SHIFTING) RECULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules 1916, No. 03, as amended by Statutory Rules, 1917; Nos. 245, 263, and 294.)

After regulation 4 of the War Procentions (Shipping) Regulations tha following regulation is inserted :---

"5. (1) The mesicrs, exuers, agains and characters of avery cover received registered in Australia or angaged in the consting trade shall constitution scornity comply with every direction given by the Commonwealth Shipping Bard in relation to the movements and use of the restoi and the carrings of cargo.

"(2) The Prime Minister may cancel or vary, as in his opinion the case may require, any contract the earrying out of which is in his opinion frectosistont with any directions given by the Cammonwealth Shipping Board in pursuance of this regulation.

" (3) For the purposes of this regulation a vessel shall be deemed to be engaged in the consting trade if she takes on board passengers, or cargo at any port in a State, or a Territory which is part of the Commonwealth, to be carried to, or landed at, any other port in the same State or Territory, or in any other State or other such Territory.

Provided that a vessel shall not be deemed to be engaged in the consting trade by reason of the fact that she carries-

- (a) Passengers who hald turough tickets to or from a port beyend Australia and the Territories under the authority of the German weakin; er
  (b) Cargo cousigned on a through hill of lading to or from a
- (b) Cargo cousigned on a through hill of lading to or from a port beyond Australia and these Torritories and which is not translipped to or from any vessel trading exclusively in Australian waters; er
- (c) Mails between any parts in Australia or in any of those Territories.

" (4) Any direction purporting to be signed by the Chairman or Dapity Chairman or by the Scoretary of the Cammeawealth Shipping Board by authority of the Board, shall until the caatrary is shown be deemed to have been given by the Board."
