REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1014-1010.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) RESULATIONS 1016—REGULATION 6—AMERIMENT.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulation under the War Precuntions Act 1914-1916 to come into enceration forthwith.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSEDETS) REQUIATIONS 1016.

Amendment.

Sub-regulation (3) of regulation 6 of the War Precautions (Passports) Regulations, which reads as follows:—

"(3) Before an alien semmn signed on outside the Commonwealth is discharged in the Commonwealth, he shall (unless exempted under clouse (iin) of sub-regulation (1) of regulation 6), lodge his passport with an officer authorized to receive it."

is amended to read as follows:-

"(3) Before an alice scanner signed on outside the Commonwealth is discharged in the Commonwealth, he shalt ledge his passport (unless exempted under these Regulations from so doing) and also any certificate of nationality or other official certificate establishing his nationality and identity which is to his possession, with an officer authorized to receive such documents."
