REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT 1914-16.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REGULATIONS 1916—REGULATION 7A.— ADDITION.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulation under the *War Precautions Act 1914-16* to come into operation forthwith.

WAR PRECAUTIONS (PASSPORTS) REGULATIONS 1916.—ADDITION.

War Precautions (Passports) Regulations 1916 are amended by inserting the following new regulation after regulation 7 :—

“ 7A. Any person who—

- (a) lands in the Commonwealth in contravention of these Regulations ; or
- (b) being a passenger on a vessel which enters Australian waters, is not in possession of a passport ; or
- (c) being a member of the crew of a vessel, and not being in possession of a passport, deserts from his vessel,
- (d) being a member of the crew of a vessel, and not being in possession of a passport, in the opinion of a competent naval or military authority intends to desert his vessel,

may be required by a competent naval or military authority to leave the Commonwealth ; and until he leaves he may be detained in such manner as a competent naval or military authority may direct and whilst so detained shall be deemed to be in legal custody.
