AUSTRALIAN MILITARY REGULATIONS 1916,

Amendment.

Regulation 753 is amended by deleting the words:-

"When the expense of sending such escort amounts to more than \$23, the ease should be referred to the District Commandant"

and by substituting in lien thereof the words:-

"If the organise of sending an escort oxceeds £3 a Commanding Officer before sending the escort should except in a case of great urgeacy or in time of war obtain the approval of the Commander of the formation or District Base Commandant as the case may be."
