REGULATIONS UNDER THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT 1901-1923.

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the undermentioned amended Regulations under the *Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1923*, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules 1913, No. 348, as amended to this date.)

1. Regulations 185, 190, 191, 193, 258, 259, 260, 261, 262, 263, 264, 265, 266, 267, and 272 are amended by omitting the words "value payable" wherever appearing, and inserting in their stead the words "cash on delivery".

2. Regulation 203 is amended by inserting after the word "glassware" the words "phonograph records".

3. Regulation 247 is amended by inserting after the word "glassware" the words "phonograph records".

4. Regulation 270 is amended—

(a) by omitting therefrom the word "value-payable" where first appearing, and inserting in its stead the words "cash on delivery";

(b) by omitting therefrom the words "value-payable journal opposite the record of the parcel", and inserting in their stead the words "required form".
