MEGULATION UNDER THE POST AND TELEGRAPH AOT 1901-1923.



AMENDMENT OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS.
(Statutory Rules 1913, No. 348, as amended to this date.)
The following regulation is inserted after regulation 34:—

34A. The sender of an unregistered pt. all article in respect of which postage at letter rate is paid shall, if the article is made up in such a manner that it might be missinken for an article of the second class, endorse the article on the address side with the words "Letter Post" and mark it by drawing lines across the front and back, in colour other than red, thus -
