REGULATION UNDER THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT 1901-1946.*

AMENDMENT OF THE TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS.†

Regulation 75 of the Telegraph Regulations is amended by omitting from sub-regulation (5.) the words "if the message is telephoned between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on any day except Sunday—" and inserting in their stead the words "if the message is telephoned between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed at the telegraph office or between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any other day except Sunday—".
