REGULATIONS UNDER THE DEFENCE ACT 1903-1950.*



AMENDMENTS OF THE ROYAL MILITARY COLLEGE REGULATIONS.†

1. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the thirty-first day of January, 1948.

2. Regulations 46, 47 and 48 of the Royal Military College Regulations are repealed and the following regulations inserted in their stead:—

“46. There shall be an account for each cadet into which shall be paid the amounts to be credited to a cadet under this Part and from which shall be deducted the amounts chargeable under this Part. Cadet's accounts.”

“47.—(1.) The account of each cadet shall be credited with such pay and allowances and each cadet shall be issued with such clothing and uniforms and provided with such rations, quarters and medical and dental treatment as the Minister, with the concurrence of the Treasurer, approves. Amounts to be credited to and charged against, cadet's accounts.”

(2.) The cost of replacing a cadet's uniform and clothing and the cost of books, instruments, messing, washing and such other expenses as the Commandant determines shall be charged against a cadet's account.”
