MINISTERS OF STATE.

No. 1 of 1952.

An Act to determine the number of the Ministers of State and to make provision for their Salaries and Allowances.

[Assented to 13th March, 1952.]

B E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Ministers of State Act 1952.

2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the commencement. first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two.

3. The Acts specified in the Schedule to this Act are repealed.

4. The number of the Ministers of State shall not exceed twenty.

5. The annual sum payable in pursuance of section sixty-six of salartes or the Constitution for the salaries of the Ministers of State shall not exceed Forty-one thousand pounds.

6. There is payable to the Prime Minister, out of the Consolidated Additional Revenue Fund, which is appropriated accordingly, an allowance, in Allowance te addition to his salary, at the rate of Three thousand five hundred pounds a year.
