AMENDMENTS OF THE POSTAL AND TELEGRAPHIC SERVICES (GENERAL) REGULATIONS†

- 1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of Commence-February, 1966.
- 2. Regulation 4 of the Postal and Telegraphic Services (General) Lottering in Regulations is amended by omitting the symbol and figure "£5" and Post Offices. inserting in their stead the words "Ten dollars".
- 3. Regulation 5 of the Postal and Telegraphic Services (General) Regu-Production of lations is amended by omitting from paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (2.) documents. the words "One guinea" and inserting in their stead the words "Two dollars and ten cents".
- 4. Regulation 8 of the Postal and Telegraphic Services (General) Business outside normal hours. Regulations is amended-

- (a) by omitting from paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (1.) and paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (2.) the words "One shilling and sixpence" and inserting in their stead the words "Fifteen cents";
- (b) by omitting from sub-regulation (2A.) the words "One pound ten shillings" (wherever occurring) and inserting in their stead the words "Three dollars"; and

- (c) by omitting from sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (d) of sub-regulation (3.) the words "One shilling and sixpence" and inserting in their stead the words "Fifteen cents".
- 5. Regulation 8A of the Postal and Telegraphic Services (General) Interference Regulations is amended by omitting from sub-regulation (6.) the words with property of Postmaster-"Ten shillings" and "Ten pounds" and inserting in their stead the words General.
