#### **REGULATION UNDER THE TRADE COMMISSIONERS ACT 1933-1973.\***

#### AMENDMENT OF THE TRADE COMMISSIONERS REGULATIONS†

After regulation 14 of the Trade Commissioners Regulations the following regulations are inserted:---

"15. A Commissioner may be granted leave of absence for a period not exceeding three days without deduction from recreation leave upon the death of a spouse, parent, brother, sister or child of the Commissioner,

"15A. (1) A Commissioner may, upon sufficient cause being shown, be granted leave of absence for a period not exceeding three days in any period of twelve months without deduction from recreation leave-

- (a) to carry out pre-embarkation arrangements;
- (b) to carry out settling-in arrangements;
- (c) to attend at, and sit for, prescribed examinations; and
- (d) to deal with an emergency of a domestic nature other than the death of a relative referred to in regulation 15.

"(2) In this regulation "prescribed examination" means an examination in a course for a degree or diploma at a university or other institution.

"15B. For the purposes of regulations 15 and 15A, bereavement leave or special leave, as the case may be, shall be granted-

- (a) in the case of a Trade Commissioner-by the Minister; and
- (b) in the case of an Assistant Trade Commissioner-by the Trade Commissioner who supervises the performance of duties by the Assistant Trade Commissioner.".
