Remuneration and Allowances Act 1979

No. 140 of 1979

An Act relating to certain remuneration and allowances.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen, and the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:

PART I-PRELIMINARY

1. This Act may be cited as the *Remuneration and Allowances Act* Short title 1979.¹

2. (1) Subject to sub-section (2), this Act shall come into operation Commenceon the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.¹

(2) The amendments made by sections 9 and 10 shall be deemed to have taken effect on 1 July 1979.

Salaries and allowances of holders of certain offices 9. Section 13 of the Principal Act is amended-

- (a) by omitting from paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) "(if any)";
- (b) by omitting sub-section (4) and substituting the following sub-section:

"(4) If the person who holds the office of Chairman of the Law Reform Commission also holds the office of—

- (a) Judge (other than Chief Judge) of the Federal Court of Australia;
- (b) Judge (other than Chief Judge) of the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory;
- (c) Judge (other than Chief Judge) of the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory; or
- (d) Deputy President of the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission,

he shall, while he continues to hold both those offices, receive, in respect of his office as Chairman of the Law Reform Commission, in addition to the salary and annual allowance by which he is remunerated in respect of the other office held by him, an annual allowance at the rate of \$275 per annum."; and

(c) by omitting from sub-section (5) "\$55" and substituting "\$60".
