REGULATIONS UNDER THE CUSTOMS ACT 1901-1954.*

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *Customs Act 1901-1954*.

CUSTOMS (PROHIBITED IMPORTS) REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations. Citation.

2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears-- Definitions.

"flash point" means the temperature at which petroleum and shale products (including kerosene) give off an inflammable vapor upon being tested by the Abel ~~Flash Point Apparatus~~;

"pistol" includes any lethal weapon, ordinarily capable of being carried concealed on the person, from which any shot, bullet or missile can be discharged;

"the British Pharmacopoeia" means--

(a) the latest edition (being an edition that has taken effect) for the time being of the book called the British Pharmacopoeia published under the direction of the General Medical Council of the United Kingdom; or

(b) if that book has been added to or amended by additions and amendments that have taken effect--that edition as affected by those additions or amendments.

3. The importation into Australia of the goods specified in the First Schedule to these Regulations is prohibited absolutely. Goods the importation of which is prohibited absolutely.

4.--(1.) The importation into Australia of the goods specified in the Second Schedule to these Regulations is prohibited unless the permission in writing of the Minister to import the goods has been granted. Goods the importation of which is prohibited unless conditions or restrictions complied with.

PENSKY CLOSED TEST APPARATUS

(2.) The importation into Australia of the goods specified in the second column of the Third Schedule to these Regulations is prohibited unless the conditions, restrictions or requirements specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite to the description of the goods are complied with.

5.—(1.) The importation into Australia of any of the drugs specified in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations is prohibited—

certain drugs.

- (a) unless the person importing the drugs has been granted a licence to import drugs under sub-regulation (3.) of this regulation and the licence is in force; and
- (b) unless the permission in writing of the Collector to each importation of the drugs has been granted and is in force.

(2.) An application for a licence and an application for a permission under this regulation shall be in writing and shall be lodged with the Collector.

(3.) The Collector, in his discretion, may grant or refuse an application for a licence or permission under this regulation and may revoke a licence or permission so granted.

(4.) A licence granted under this regulation is subject to compliance by the person to whom it is granted with the following requirements in relation to each of the drugs specified in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations which come into his possession:—

- (a) the person shall not dispose of a drug or a substance or mixture in the preparation of which a drug has been used except for use for medical or scientific purposes and after the person has satisfied himself that it will be so used;
- (b) the person shall not dispose of a drug or a substance or mixture in the preparation of which a drug has been used except to a person approved by the Collector;
- (c) the person shall keep all drugs and all substances and mixtures in the preparation of which a drug has been used in safe custody until he disposes of them;
- (d) the person shall record in books kept by him for that purpose—
 - (i) the quantity of each drug and each substance and mixture in the preparation of which a drug has been used, and the name and address of the person from whom he obtained the drug or the substance or mixture;
 - (ii) the quantity of each drug and each substance or mixture in the preparation of which a drug has been used supplied by him to another person, and the name and address of that person; and
 - (iii) the quantity of each drug used by him in the manufacture of substances or mixtures, the quantity of each drug lost, destroyed, evaporated or wasted in that manufacture and the quantity and nature of the substances and mixtures;

- (e) the person shall retain the books so kept by him until the Collector approves of their destruction;
- (f) the person shall, when required by the Collector—
- (i) produce for examination the books so kept; and
 - (ii) produce for examination all drugs and all substances and mixtures in the preparation of which a drug has been used in his possession.

(5.) A permit granted under this regulation is subject to such conditions (if any) as the Collector specifies in the permission.

(6.) The continuance in force of a licence under this regulation is subject to the condition that the importer furnishes security to the satisfaction of the Collector for compliance with the Act and for compliance with the requirements to which the licence is subject.

(7.) A licence to import drugs issued under the Regulations repealed by regulation 7 of these Regulations and in force immediately before the commencement of these Regulations shall be deemed to be a licence granted under sub-regulation (3.) of this regulation.

6. The provisions of these Regulations are in addition to, and do not derogate from, the operation of any other law of the Commonwealth relating to the importation of goods into Australia. Regulations do not derogate from any other law.

7. The Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations (comprising the Statutory Rules specified in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations) are repealed. Repeal.
