REGULATIONS UNDER THE WAR PRECAUTIONS ACT
REPEAL ACT 1920.

I THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *War Precautions Act Repeal Act 1920*, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF PROTECTION OF WORD "ANZAC" REGULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules 1921, No. 2.)

1. After regulation 1 of the Protection of Word "Anzac" Regulations the following regulation is inserted:—

Definition.

"1A. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
'Entertainment' includes any exhibition, performance, lecture, amusement, game, sport or social gathering held or conducted for the purpose of raising money."

2. Regulation 2 of the Protection of Word "Anzac" Regulations is amended—

- (a) by inserting in sub-regulation (1) after the words "profession or" the words "in connexion with any entertainment or any lottery or art union or"; and
- (b) by adding at the end of sub-regulation (1) the words "Penalty: One hundred pounds or imprisonment for six months, or both."
