## South Pacific Nuclear Free Zone Consultative Committee (Privileges and Immunities) Regulations

I, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *International Organizations (Privileges and Immunities) Act 1963*.

**Citation**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the South Pacific Nuclear Free Zone Consultative Committee (Privileges and Immunities) Regulations.

**Interpretation**

- 2. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—  
 “Committee” means the South Pacific Nuclear Free Zone Consultative Committee;  
 “the Act” means the *International Organizations (Privileges and Immunities) Act 1963*.

**Act to apply to Committee**

3. The Committee is declared to be an international organization to which the Act applies.

**Committee to have juridical personality and legal capacities**

- 4. The Committee—
  - (a) is a body corporate with perpetual succession;
  - (b) has the capacity to contract; and

(c) is capable, in its corporate name, of acquiring, holding and disposing of real and personal property and of instituting legal proceedings.

**Privileges and immunities of persons working with the Committee**

5. (1) A person who is participating in the work of the Committee or is performing, whether alone or jointly with other persons, a mission on behalf of the Committee has the privileges and immunities specified in paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Part I of the Fifth Schedule to the Act.

(2) A person who has participated in the work of the Committee or who has performed a mission on behalf of the Committee has the immunities specified in Part II of the Fifth Schedule to the Act.

**Waiver**

6. The Committee may waive any privileges and immunities to which a person upon whom privileges and immunities are conferred by regulation 5 is entitled by virtue of the Act or these Regulations.
