REGULATION UNDER THE TREATY OF PEACE (GERMANY) ACT 1919-1920.

I THE GOVERNOR GENERAL in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following regulation under the *Treaty of Peace (Germany) Act* 1919-1920, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF THE TREATY OF PEACE REGULATIONS.

(Statutory Rules 1920, No. 25, as amended to this date.)

Regulation 20c, as made by Statutory Rule 1922, No. 127, is hereby repealed and the following regulation insorted in its stead :----

"20p. Where any property right or interest vested in the Pub-Resistration of lie Trustee by the Minister under these Regulations consists of an Public Trustee estate or interest in land and a copy of the vosting order certified more the hand of the Public Trustee is lodged with the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles or other proper officer of the State or part of the Commonwealth in which the land is situate, the Registrar-General, Registrar of Titles or other proper officer shall, whether the duplicate grant or Certificate of Title in respect of the land is produced or not, register the Public Trustee as the registered proprietor of the land, and shall, upon payment of the proper fee (if any) deliver to him a Certificate of Title in respect thereof."
