

# Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation Amendment Regulations 2005 (No. 2)<sup>1</sup>

### 1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation Amendment Regulations 2005 (No. 2).

### 2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on the day after they are registered.

### 3 Amendment of Australian Wine and Brandy **Corporation Regulations 1981**

Schedule 1 amends the Australian Wine and Brandy Corporation Regulations 1981.

### [1] **Regulation 6A**

### Conditions of export — food standards 6A

- (1) The export of a grape product is prohibited unless:
  - (a) the product complies with the Food Standards Code; or
  - if the product does not comply with the Code the Corporation approves, under subregulation (2), the export of the product by the exporter.
- (2) The Corporation may approve the export, by a particular exporter, of a grape product that does not comply with the Code if the Corporation is satisfied that:
  - the product meets any requirements for grape products imposed by the country to which the product is to be exported; and

- (b) the non-compliance will not compromise the reputation of Australian grape products.
- (3) The approval must be given to the exporter in writing and must state:
  - (a) the particulars of the non-compliance; and
  - (b) that the product must comply with the Code in any other respect.

# [2] After paragraph 10 (a)

insert

(aa) a decision by the Corporation under subregulation 6A (2) to approve, or refuse to approve, the export of a grape product that does not comply with the Food Standards Code; or
