1. LEGISLATIVE PROVISIONS

- 1.1. Name of Legislative Instrument
- 1.1.1. This instrument is the Vehicle Standard (Australian Design Rule 23/02 Passenger Car Tyres) 2007 Amendment 1.
- 1.2. Commencement
- 1.2.1. This instrument commences on the day after it is registered.

2. AMENDMENT OF VEHICLE STANDARD

2.1. The changes specified in Schedule 1 amend Vehicle Standard (Australian Design Rule 23/02 – Passenger Car Tyres) 2007.

SCHEDULE 1

[1] Page 5

Delete the entry at 4.1 to 4.5 and insert the following;

- 4.1 For vehicle categories, definitions and meanings used in this standard refer to;
- 4.1.1 Australian Design Rules Third Edition;
- 4.1.2 Part A, Subpart 4, Terms defined in the *Motor Vehicle Standards Act 1989*;
- 4.1.3 Part B, Subpart 2, Definitions and Vehicle Categories;
- 4.2 Section 2 of Appendix A.
- [2] Page 5

Insert the following at Clause 5 - Requirements:

- Pneumatic tyres shall bear the date of manufacture in the form of a group of four digits, the first two showing the week and the last two the year of manufacture. The marking shall meet the requirements of Annex 3 Arrangement of Tyre Markings and may be placed on one side wall only.

Insert the following footnote to:

Section 3 Markings, clauses $3.1.9.^{1/2}$ and 3.1.11.1.
