Citation

1. This Determination may be cited as the Currency Determination No. 7 of 1997.

Commencement

2. This Determination commences on 1 January 1998.

Specification of coins

- **3.** This Determination specifies, for a coin of a kind having the denomination and standard composition specified in columns 1 and 2 in Part 1 of the Schedule, and a design specified in column 5 of that Part:
 - (a) the standard weight, and allowable variation from that weight, specified for a coin of that kind in column 3 of that Part; and
 - (b) the dimensions specified for a coin of that kind in column 4 of that Part.

Application of Determination

4. This Determination does not affect any other determination of the specifications of a coin.
