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**1 Name of Regulations**

These Regulations are the *Extradition (Safety of United Nations and Associated Personnel) Amendment Regulations 2009 (No. 1)*.

**2 Commencement**

These Regulations commence on the day after they are registered.

**3 Amendment of *Extradition (Safety of United Nations and Associated Personnel) Regulations 2000***

Schedule 1 amends the *Extradition (Safety of United Nations and Associated Personnel) Regulations 2000*.

**4 Extradition countries**

For the definition of *extradition country* in section 5 of the Act, a country, or a colony, territory or protectorate of a country, for which the Convention is in force is an extradition country.

*Note 1* For when the Convention enters into force for a State, see Article 27 of the Convention in Schedule 1.

**5 Application of the Act**

The Act applies, subject to the Convention, to an extradition country mentioned in regulation 4.
