This Determination is made due to a decision of the Australian Government to transfer functions relating to the development and management of the National Healthy Workplace Employer Awards within the Healthy Workers Initiative, under the National Partnership Agreement on Preventive Health function from the Department of Health and Ageing to the Australian National Preventive Health Agency.

1 Name of Determination

This Determination is the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 Determination 2012/01 — Section 32 (Transfer of Functions from HEALTH to ANPHA)*.

Note 1: This Determination has been made by a delegate of the Secretary of the Department of Finance and Deregulation. The Secretary is a delegate of the Minister for Finance and Deregulation in accordance with section 62 of the FMA Act. The Secretary has delegated his power in accordance with section 53 of the FMA Act.

Note 2: Acronyms used in this Determination are as follows:

- (a) “HEALTH” – refers to the Department of Health and Ageing.
- (b) “ANPHA” – refers to the Australian National Preventive Health Agency.

Note 3: Responsibility for the development and management of the National Healthy Workplace Employer Awards within the Healthy Workers Initiative, under the National Partnership Agreement on Preventive Health function was transferred from HEALTH to ANPHA due to a request by the Health and Ageing Minister to the Prime Minister. This transfer request was approved on 26 September 2011.

2 Commencement

This Determination commences on the day on which it is made.

Note: Under subsection 32(8) of the FMA Act, a determination may be expressed to take effect before its making and registration under the *Legislative Instruments Act 2003*.

3 Amendment of *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2011-2012*

Schedule 1 amends *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2011-2012* to:

- (a) Reduce the administered item alongside Outcome 1 for Health by \$480,000.00; and
- (b) Increase the administered item alongside Outcome 1 for ANPHA by \$480,000.00.
