For these Regulations, *export sanctioned goods* means arms or related materiel.

- (e) is a supply of non-lethal law enforcement equipment that:
 - (i) is intended to enable the Ivorian security forces to use only appropriate and proportionate force while maintaining public order; and

- (ii) is notified in advance to the Committee; or
- (f) is a supply of arms or other related lethal equipment to the Ivorian security forces that:
 - (i) is intended solely for the support of, or use in, the Ivorian process of Security Sector Reform; and
 - (ii) is approved in advance by the Committee.

For these Regulations, *import* sanctioned goods means charcoal.

Division 2.3 Sanctioned imports

15A Prohibitions relating to import sanctioned goods

- (1) A person contravenes this regulation if the person procures import sanctioned goods from Somalia or from a person or entity in Somalia.
- (2) A body corporate contravenes this regulation if:
 - (a) the body corporate has effective control over the actions of another body corporate or entity, wherever incorporated or situated; and

(b) the other body corporate or entity procures import sanctioned goods from Somalia or a person or entity in Somalia.

Note This regulation is a UN sanction enforcement law as specified by the Minister under the Charter of the United Nations (UN Sanction Enforcement Law) Declaration 2008.
