1 Name of Order

This Order is *Marine Order 75 (Seafarer certification amendment) 2016*.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day after it is registered.

3 Repeal of *Marine Order 6 (Marine radio qualifications) 2000*

Marine Order 6 (Marine radio qualifications) 2000 is repealed.

- (a) is at least 18 years old; and
- (b) has completed an approved course in radio communication that complies with STCW Code section A-IV/2.

25A Requirements for revalidation of GMDSS radio operator certificate

The requirements for revalidation of a GMDSS radio operator certificate are that the person holding the certificate:

- (a) has maintained a radio watch as a master or an officer of the watch in a seagoing vessel fully fitted with GMDSS equipment for at least:
 - (i) 12 months in the 5 years before the application for revalidation; or
 - (ii) 3 months in the 6 months before the application for revalidation; or
- (b) has performed functions that relate to the kind of GMDSS certificate held by the person that AMSA considers to be at least equivalent to those mentioned in paragraph (a); or
- (c) has completed, within the 5 years before the date of application for revalidation, approved training that AMSA considers provides appropriate training for performing radio operator duties or functions.

- (1) A person who holds an appropriate radio operator certificate may apply to AMSA under subsection 30(1) of the Navigation Act for a certificate of recognition of the appropriate radio operator certificate.
- (2) A person who holds a radio operator certificate issued by a country with which Australia has no agreement for recognition of GMDSS certificates may apply to AMSA under subsection 30(1) of the Act for a restricted certificate of recognition of the certificate.

 - (iii) security awareness (as specified in STCW Code Table A-VI/6-1); and
 - (b) hold a certificate of medical fitness.
- (6) For this Option, approved courses must be completed within the 5 years before the date of applying for revalidation of the certificate.
