


# **Legislation (ACT Self-Government Instruments) Sunset-altering Declaration 2017**



#### 1 Name

This instrument is the *Legislation (ACT Self-Government Instruments) Sunset-altering Declaration 2017.* 

#### 2 Commencement

(1) Each provision of this instrument specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.

#### 3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsection 51A(1) of the Legislation Act 2003.

### 4 Repeal of ACT self-government instruments to facilitate review etc.

- (1) The following instruments are repealed by subsection 51A(1) of the *Legislation Act 2003* on 1 April 2020:
  - (a) the A.C.T. Self-Government (Consequential Provisions) Regulations;
  - (b) the Australian Capital Territory (Planning and Land Management) Regulations;
  - (c) the Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Regulations 1989;
  - (d) the National Land Ordinance 1989 (ACT);
  - (e) the National Memorials Ordinance 1928 (ACT);
  - (f) the Reserved Laws (Administration) Ordinance 1989 (ACT);
  - (g) the Reserved Laws (Interpretation) Ordinance 1989 (ACT);
  - (h) the Seat of Government (Administration) Regulations.
- (2) Those instruments:
  - (a) would, apart from this instrument, be repealed by section 50 of the *Legislation Act 2003*; and
  - (b) are or will be the subject of a single review.
- (3) The making of this instrument will facilitate the undertaking of the review of those instruments and the implementation of its findings.
