1 Name

- (1) This instrument is the Australian Citizenship (IMMI 17/073: Declared Terrorist Organisation—Jabhat Al-Nusra) Declaration 2017.
- (2) This instrument may be cited as IMMI 17/073.

2 Commencement

(1) Each provision of this instrument specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under section 35AA of the *Australian Citizenship Act* 2007.

4 Declared terrorist organisation—Jabhat al-Nusra

The organisation that was known as Jabhat al-Nusra (among other names) at the time this instrument commenced is declared as a declared terrorist organisation for the purposes of section 35AA of the *Australian Citizenship Act 2007*.

- Note 1: Subsection 35AA(1) of the *Australian Citizenship Act 2007* requires an organisation declared under that subsection to be a terrorist organisation within the meaning of paragraph (b) of the definition of *terrorist organisation* in subsection 102.1(1) of the *Criminal Code*, which covers organisations specified by regulations.
- Note 2: When this instrument commenced, the organisation known as Jabhat al-Nusra was such a terrorist organisation because it was specified by section 5 of the *Criminal Code* (*Terrorist Organisation—Jabhat al-Nusra*) Regulation 2016. Jabhat al-Nusra was at that time also known by a variety of other names listed in that section. After that commencement, if the name (or names) by which the organisation is known changes, that regulation may be amended to ensure that the organisation is still so specified (see section 102.1AA of the *Criminal Code*).
- Note 3: However, if no regulation is in effect that specifies the organisation for the purposes of the *Criminal Code*, this instrument also has no effect. The *Criminal Code (Terrorist Organisation—Jabhat al-Nusra) Regulation 2016* ceases to have effect on 28 June 2019 at the latest, but may cease to have effect earlier if repealed, or if a notice is

published under subsection 102.1(4) of the *Criminal Code* in relation to the organisation (see subsection 102.1(3) of the *Criminal Code*).
