1 Name

This instrument is the *Biosecurity (Prohibited and Conditionally Non-prohibited Goods—Norfolk Island) Amendment (Alternative Conditions—Honey and Metal Ores) Determination 2019*.

2 Commencement

3 Authority

Schedule 1—Amendments

Biosecurity (Prohibited and Conditionally Non-prohibited Goods—Norfolk Island) Determination 2016

1 Subsection 5(1)

Insert:

Terrestrial Animal Health Code means the *Terrestrial Animal Health Code* promulgated by the World Organisation for Animal Health, as in force from time to time.

2 After paragraph 6(2)(b)

Insert:

- (c) honey that is an ingredient in food for human consumption or cosmetics for use on humans, where honey is not the largest single ingredient by volume in the food or cosmetics;

3 Section 14 (table item 1)

Repeal the item, substitute:

1	Honey (whether or not containing honeycomb)	All of the following: (a) the goods are for personal use; (b) the goods are commercially prepared and packaged; (c) the weight of the goods is not more than 750 grams; (d) the goods were produced in Australia or New Zealand; (e) the goods are not intended to be used as food for bees; (f) the goods are labelled with: (i) the weight of the goods; and (ii) the country where the goods were produced
2	The following goods: (a) honey in liquid form contained in an individually packaged unit with a capacity of 150 millilitres or less; (b) powdered honey contained in an individually packaged unit with a capacity of 35 grams or less	All of the following: (a) the goods have been processed so that they are clean and free from other animal or plant material, soil and other contaminants; (b) the goods: (i) are commercially prepared and packaged for retail sale; or (ii) are a sample for use in laboratory analysis; (c) the goods are accompanied by a declaration from the manufacturer of the goods stating the matter referred to in paragraph (a) and a matter referred to in paragraph (b) that applies to the goods

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4 Subsection 40(2)

Repeal the subsection, substitute:

Conditions

- (2) Goods included in a class of goods to which this section applies must not be brought or imported into Norfolk Island unless the goods are covered by an import permit.
