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1 Name

This instrument is the Poisons Standard Amendment (Hydroxychloroquine) Instrument 2020.

	(1)	 following the commencement of the <i>Poisons Standard Amendment</i> (<i>Hydroxychloroquine and Salbutamol) Instrument 2020</i>—a medical practitioner registered under State or Territory legislation that forms part of the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as a specialist in any of the following recognised specialties: (a) dermatology; (b) emergency medicine; (c) intensive care medicine; (d) paediatrics and child health; (e) physician; 	
	(2)	following the commencement of the <i>Poisons Standard Amendment</i> (<i>Hydroxychloroquine</i>) Instrument 2020—a dental practitioner registered under State or Territory legislation that forms part of the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as a specialist in the recognised specialty of oral medicine.
