#### 1 Name

This instrument is the *Industry Research and Development (Modern Manufacturing Initiative Program) Instrument 2021*.

#### 2 Commencement

#### 3 Authority

This instrument is made under section 33 of the *Industry Research and Development Act 1986*.

#### 4 Definitions

In this instrument:

Act means the Industry Research and Development Act 1986.

*program*: see subsection 5(1).

### 5 Prescribed program

- (1) For the purposes of subsection 33(1) of the Act, the Modern Manufacturing Initiative Program (the *program*) is prescribed.
- (2) The program provides funding on a co-investment basis to stimulate business investment in the manufacturing sector by supporting the following:
  - (a) large projects that bring together businesses, researchers and investors to build economies of scale and allow businesses to better compete in international markets;
  - (b) projects aimed at translating research into commercial solutions;
  - (c) projects that target the integration of Australian businesses into domestic and global value chains.

- (3) The purposes of the program are to:
  - (a) address barriers to scale and competitiveness for Australian manufacturing; and
  - (b) build manufacturing capabilities and networks, lift productivity, create jobs and boost the export potential and global competitiveness of Australian businesses.

## 6 Specified legislative power

For the purposes of subsection 33(3) of the Act, the powers of the Parliament to make laws with respect to the following are specified:

- (a) trade and commerce with other countries, and among the States (within the meaning of paragraph 51(i) of the Constitution);
- (b) foreign corporations, and trading or financial corporations formed within the limits of the Commonwealth (within the meaning of paragraph 51(xx) of the Constitution).
