Insert:

52 Grant to Superannuation Consumers' Centre Ltd (known as Super Consumers Australia) To fund Superannuation Consumers' Centre Ltd to:

- (a) represent the interests of superannuation members in superannuation-related policy debates for the purpose of informing the development of Commonwealth policy;
 and
- (b) conduct research and analysis on superannuation-related issues affecting superannuation members for the purposes of:
 - (i) informing the development of Commonwealth policy; and
 - (ii) assisting superannuation members to understand the operation of Commonwealth laws and policies.
