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## 1 Name

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## Schedule 1—Amendments

### *Financial Framework (Supplementary Powers) Regulations 1997*

#### **1 Part 4 of Schedule 1AB (table item 298)**

Repeal the item, substitute:

298	Jobs and Market Fund	<p>To promote the effective operation of the National Disability Insurance Scheme, the <i>Aged Care Act 1997</i> and the <i>Veterans' Entitlement Act 1986</i> by funding activities directed to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) increasing the number and capability of disability support, aged care and veterans' care service providers and workers; and</li><li>(b) ensuring that there are sufficient disability support, aged care and veterans' care service providers and workers to service all areas of need.</li></ul> <p>This objective has the effect it would have if it were limited to measures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) with respect to postal, telegraphic, telephonic and other like services (within the meaning of paragraph 51(v) of the Constitution); or</li><li>(b) to support veterans and their families; or</li><li>(c) for the provision of, or incidental to the provision of, pharmaceutical, sickness and hospital benefits, medical services and dental services, and benefits to students (within the meaning of paragraph 51(xxiiiA) of the Constitution); or</li><li>(d) to give effect to Australia's obligations under the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, particularly Articles 3, 4, 9, 19, 20, 25 and 26; or</li><li>(e) that are specifically targeted to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people; or</li><li>(f) in the exercise of the executive power of the Commonwealth.</li></ul>

539	Information, Linkages and Capacity Building	<p>To give effect to Australia's obligations under the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, particularly Articles 1, 8, 9, 19, 20, 21, 24, 25, and 29, by:</p> <p>(a) funding projects that:</p> <p>(i) create connections between people with disability, their families and carers and the communities they live in; and</p> <p>(ii) build the knowledge, skills and confidence of people with disability, their families and carers; and</p> <p>(iii) improve access to community and mainstream services for people with disability; and</p> <p>(b) providing resources and delivering activities to support prospective applicants to apply for that funding and to deliver those projects; and</p> <p>(c) providing opportunities for funding recipients to connect with each other and to share experiences and lessons from the delivery of funded projects.</p>

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
