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1 Name

This Ordinance is the *Christmas Island Applied Laws Amendment (Heritage)*Ordinance 2022.

2 Commencement

Part 15B—Heritage Act 2018 (WA) (CI)

1 At the end of Part 10

Add:

113A Compensation for acquisition of property

- (1) If the operation of this Part would result in an acquisition of property (within the meaning of paragraph 51(xxxi) of the Constitution of the Commonwealth) from a person otherwise than on just terms (within the meaning of that paragraph), the Commonwealth is liable to pay a reasonable amount of compensation to the person.
- (2) If the Commonwealth and the person do not agree on the amount of the compensation, the person may institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction for the recovery from the Commonwealth of such reasonable amount of compensation as the court determines.
