The Statement of Principles concerning *restless legs syndrome (Balance of Probabilities)* (No. 114 of 2022) (Federal Register of Legislation No. F2022L01399) is amended in the following manner:

<i>Schedule 1 – Dictionary</i>	<p><i>Replace the existing definition of "relevant service" with the following:</i></p> <p>relevant service means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(a) eligible war service (other than operational service) under the VEA;(b) defence service (other than hazardous service and British nuclear test defence service) under the VEA; or(c) peacetime service under the MRCA. <p>Note: MRCA and VEA are defined in the Schedule 1 - Dictionary.</p>
