# **Schedule 1—Amendments**

## Financial Framework (Supplementary Powers) Regulations 1997

## 1 Part 4 of Schedule 1AB (table item 239)

## 2 In the appropriate position in Part 4 of Schedule 1AB (table)

Insert:

Veterans' Acute Housing— Specialist Services To support veterans and their families who experience, or who are at risk of experiencing, homelessness by funding organisations to provide services to assist veterans and their families with:

- (a) case management and coordination; and
- (b) accessing financial or other material supports; and
- (c) accessing crisis or transitional accommodation; and
- (d) accessing mental health treatment, rehabilitation services (including alcohol and other drug programs), health services and psychosocial supports; and
- (e) identifying or securing employment; and
- (f) identifying or retaining long-term housing options; and
- (g) accessing other Commonwealth or Commonwealth-funded services and supports.
