1 Name

This instrument is the *Migration (Australia Travel Declaration—Passenger Card May Be Required) Instrument (LIN 24/075) 2024*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after it is registered.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subregulation 3.03AB(3) of the *Migration Regulations 1994* (the **Regulations**).

4 Definitions

Note: A number of expressions used in this instrument are defined in the *Migration Act 1958* and the Regulations, including the following:

- (a) *Australia Travel Declaration*;
- (b) *clearance authority*;
- (c) *clearance officer*;
- (d) *passenger card*.

In this instrument:

Regulations means the *Migration Regulations 1994*.

5 Schedules

Each instrument that is specified in a Schedule to this instrument is amended or repealed as set out in the applicable items in the Schedule concerned, and any other item in a Schedule to this instrument has effect according to its terms.

6 When a passenger card may be required

For subregulation 3.03AB(2) of the Regulations, each of the following matters is specified:

- (a) the person's Australia Travel Declaration cannot be accessed by a clearance authority;
- (b) a clearance officer reasonably suspects that the information in the person's Australia Travel Declaration is not accurate or complete.
