A BILL

To apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia as follows :— Preamble.
